School Culture

Welcome back to Term 2. I look forward to continuing to support the Beerwah community. We have analysed student behaviours from Term 1 and have identified that our focus on student's behaviour for Term 2 needs to focus on two areas:

- respectful language
- truancy

We will be explicitly teaching students to use respectful language in the following ways:

- 1) Model respect, say hello, thank you, please and good bye
- 2) Model to students how they can listen and not interrupt
- 3) Discuss respectful language using words like appreciate, admire, regard, courtesy, polite, compliment, honour etc
- 4) Remind them to consider another person's feelings
- 5) Remind them to respect diversity, backgrounds, beliefs and avoid negative and discriminatory language
- 6) Remind students to respect another person's personal space
- 7) Praise students when they use respectful language or they show respect

Student behaviour im-

proves if we explicitly teach students and set high expectations.

The leadership team are meeting this week to discuss the current consequences that are in place, how we can ensure high expectations are clear and consequences that will ensure students adapt to our expectations.

Please work with us to improve outcomes for our students and our staff. It is absolutely essential that our students use respectful language to staff at all times and that all students are in attendance 100% of the time with both parent and school aware of where students are. Students who are truant put themselves and our staff at risk and this won't be tolerated.

Beerwah Basics—Uniforms

Uniforms are compulsory at Beerwah SHS. No student at any time should be wearing black or grey jumpers or black or grey tracksuit pants. If they are then they are in breach of the uniform policy regardless of whether parents have written a note. A parent note doesn't by-

pass our uniform policy.

The uniform has improved and I would welcome your feedback on how we can make further improvements to ensure that Beerwah SHS's reputation is at a high standard in our community.

Australian Curriculum

The proposed revisions to the Australian Curriculum are now available for public comment from 29 April until 8 July 2021. Feedback and input will be used to develop final revisions.
