WHAT IS A SCHOOL BASED TRAINEESHIP OR APPRENTICESHIP?

SATs allow you to work for an employer and undertake training in a recognised qualification while completing senior studies. On completion of Year 12 you will receive a Qld Certificate of Education, have at least a Certificate

II in a chosen field and have been paid for the time spent working.

HOW DOES A SAT WORK?

SATs involve a *mix of study at school, the qualification study and paid work*. All these things form part of the school timetable. The SAT must impact on your timetable (ie working or training must happen during school hours). This could be on your timetabled day off. A minimum of 375 hours or 50 days must be worked in every 12 months of the traineeship to be eligible for completion. That means that in a two year traineeship you need to complete a total of 750 paid work hours. A traineeship is completed before leaving school, while an apprenticeship converts to full time on graduation. A certificate III level qualification banks 8 QCE credits.

WHAT TYPE OF SAT CAN YOU DO?

WHO IS INVOLVED?

- > Student (Trainee or apprentice)

All three sign a *Training Contract* which outlines responsibilities and obligations.

- Apprenticeship Network Provider (Eg: MEGT who provide the Training Contract)
- Registered Training Organisation (A trainer who delivers the qualification)
- School (to coordinate and monitor)
