UNIFORM GUIDE



The student dress code policy is detailed on the school website. This brochure is intended to provide information for parents and students about our school uniform. Students attending Beerwah State High School are required to wear the correct school uniform at school, including excursions and sport while going to and from school.

BOYS Day Uniform



- Shirt:** Multi-coloured knit cotton Beerwah SHS Junior or Senior shirt. Colour is determined by the student's year level.
- Shorts:** Dark navy blue shorts (not denim or knit fabric), non-elasticated waists and with no cargo pockets. These shorts must not be past the knee, nor shorter than 10cm above the knee (as determined by the principal or their delegate).
- Trousers:** Long navy blue dress trousers
- Socks:** White only

GIRLS Day Uniform



- Shirt:** Multi-coloured knit cotton Beerwah SHS Junior or Senior shirt. Colour is determined by the student's year level.
- Shorts:** Dark navy blue shorts (not denim or knit fabric) non -elasticated waists and with no cargo pockets. These shorts must not be past the knee, nor shorter than 10cm above the knee (as determined by the Principal or their delegate).
- Slacks:** Long navy blue slacks
- Skirt:** A-line navy blue skirt (not denim or knit fabric); These skirts must not be shorter than 5cm above the knee when standing. Slits should not extend beyond 5cm above the bottom of the skirt (as determined by the Principal or their delegate).
- Socks:** White only

Formal Uniform

The formal uniform is worn by students when participating in excursions and for very important occasions at the school such as awards night. **The formal uniform is also required to be worn by all students every Monday as this is formal assembly day.**



BOYS Formal Uniform

- Shirt:** Light blue shirt with Beerwah tri colour piping on the pocket.
Shorts: Dark navy blue shorts (not denim or knit fabric), non-elasticated waists and with no cargo pockets. These shorts must not be past the knee, nor shorter than 10cm above the knee (as determined by the principal or their delegate).
Trousers: Long navy blue dress trousers
Socks: White only



GIRLS Formal Uniform

- Shirt:** Light blue blouse with Beerwah tri colour piping on the sleeves.
Shorts: Dark navy blue shorts (not denim or knit fabric) non -elasticated waists and with no cargo pockets.; These shorts must not be past the knee, nor shorter than 10cm above the knee (as determined by the Principal or their delegate).
Slacks: Long navy blue slacks
Skirt: A-line navy blue skirt (not denim or knit fabric); These skirts must not be shorter than 5cm above the knee when standing. Slits should not extend beyond 5cm above the bottom of the skirt (as determined by the Principal or their delegate).
Socks: White only

Please Note: Board shorts, cargo pants of any description, denim, or elasticated skirts are not permitted as part of the boys or girls uniform policy.



Winter Uniform

School jackets and pullovers in the school colours and emblem are available from the Uniform Shop.

NB: A senior jersey is available by order, for year 12 Students only.

Navy blue tracksuit pants are permitted to be worn.

In terms 2 and 3 or when the weather requires warmer clothing. Girls are permitted to wear plain black or navy stockings with skirts or shorts. White socks are not worn with black stockings. If wearing plain flesh stockings then white socks will need to be worn with them.

Boys and girls may wear a plain navy blue beanie without emblems or logos. These are also available from the uniform shop. Scarves are not permitted..

Student leaders are permitted to wear their school blazer with formal uniform only.

Other Features of the Student Dress Code

Socks

Plain white, socks must be clearly visible above the top of the shoe and must cover the ankle bone.

Jewellery

Our school's policy is limited to: 1 or 2 stud or sleeper (sleeper to be no larger in diameter than 15mm) earrings in each ear and only one watch with no other adornments. Necklaces may only be worn for religious or cultural significance and **MUST** not be visible. An exemption card will be issued for such necklaces, however, these may need to be removed in specific work areas of the school for Workplace Health and Safety reasons. Each exemption card contains conditions of use. Facial piercing is not encouraged. The school will permit 1 small facial piercing (stud) no larger than 1mm which does not protrude the surface of the skin. Nose rings and/or septum piercings are not acceptable. No piercings around external mouth area are acceptable.

Make Up / Nail Polish

The wearing of make up should be limited. No obvious makeup should be evident (as determined by the Principal or their delegate). This includes coloured nail polish.

Hair

Neat, clean and tidy. Long hair must be tied back in practical classes, due to workplace health and safety regulations hair nets may need to be worn. Exotic hairstyles are not acceptable, this includes features such as unnatural and/or multiple hair colouring, extravagant ornamental hair clips, decorations, extensions or excessive braiding/plaiting.

Sports Uniform

The school will supply representation sports attire as the need arises.

Shoes

Students need to be in a solid pair of ALL black shoes that are leather or leather substitute, water resistant and cover the top of the foot to provide adequate support and protection. Black shoes must be worn everyday. Shoes with logos, coloured stripes, coloured white soles and coloured lace is not acceptable. Ankle boots are not appropriate as school footwear. Canvas and any form of light slip on ballet are also not acceptable.

Please note: students in years 8,9 and 10 should have shoes suitable for Health and Physical Education. Students not wearing appropriate shoes will not be able to participate in certain class activities in specific subjects such as science, industrial technology, food preparation/hospitality or art due to work place health and safety requirements.

To assist in selecting suitable shoes, a range of examples are illustrated. This is not an exhaustive list but intended to provide a clear guidance about suitable and unsuitable shoe types.

Non Compliance with Dress Code

(1) If a student of a state school does not comply with a dress code for the school's students, developed under section 36D, the school's Principal may only impose one of the following sanctions –

- (a) Detention of the student for a period mentioned in section 283(3);
- (b) Prevent the student from attending, or participating in, any activity for which the student would have been representing the school;
